- The Company will take whatever measures necessary to ensure the collection, transportation, and storage which it operates, are not and do not become hazardous to public health or the environment.
- The Company will ensure that all collection, transportation and disposal of waste from its customers sites is covered by a written agreement, letter, order or confirmed acknowledgment, as well as the appropriate documentation to ensure that the Duty of Care (Section 34) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990, is fully complied with, regarding Controlled Waste Transfer Notes and waste descriptions.
- We are driving to reduce our Carbon footprint by intelligent engineer scheduling, by assiduous office and warehouse energy management and by using 'environmentally friendly' technology such as Skype.
- We will evaluate and audit our process annually to ensure compliance and place environmental considerations high in our business model.
